Legislation Amendment Bill 2018

Dear members of the Standing Committee on Legislation,

We are writing to address your inquiry into Human Reproductive Technology and Surrogacy Legislation Amendment Bill 2018, which we understand will amend the Human Reproductive Technology Act 1991 and the Surrogacy Act 2008 to enable male same sex couples and single men to access surrogacy.

We are opposed to this Bill because we want to see laws upheld which reflect God's ordinances, including God's design for a family unit, where children are conceived/adopted, raised and nurtured by a married father and mother.

We believe that laws should be opposed which undermine this design.

We think that this Bill will result in injustice to the children, who will deliberately be removed from their natural (birth) mothers to be placed in motherless homes, and possibly to the surrogate mothers as well as they are in danger of being exploited.

The debate however is currently **not** conducted from the perspective of children but framed entirely from the perspective of adults...

Surrogacy continues the process of fracturing families, and creates ongoing ethical issues. It will damage the children as they are in danger of becoming a commodity and as such may grow up into confused and/or unhappy teenagers, or even adults.
