In addition we ask that the Legislative Council examine the terms of reference, transparency and independence of the newly appointed panel.

Petroleum recently awarded a contract to the Australian Centre for Geomechanics to examine WA's ability to adequately manage this noxious industry. We the undersigned residents of Western Australia are concerned about the level of transparency of the Panel and the process by which it was selected and appointed, given that access to the full terms of reference for the panel has been denied, and there are no requirements for the panel to engage in any way with the public. The Australian Centre for Geomechanics is funded by mining companies which have vested interests in uranium mining, compromising the independence of the panel.
