

Estimates and Financial Operations Committee 2018-19 Budget Estimates hearings - Questions prior to hearings

Western Australian Planning Commission

The Committee asked:

1 For each project identified in your asset investment program in Budget Paper No 2, was it subject to cost-benefit analysis and, if so, what was its ratio?

Answer:

Many future purchases are yet to be specifically determined and therefore cost-benefit analysis does not exist. The Western Australian Planning Commission's (WAPC) 2018-19 Asset Investment Program (AIP) of \$37.4m mainly includes the acquisition of land reserved under the Metropolitan, Peel and Greater Bunbury Regional Schemes utilising a market valuation and assessment approach and development of facilities on reserved land. Also included in the forward estimates period is asset investment on WAPC land to support the METRONET project.

Hon Peter Collier MLC asked:

1. How many Aboriginal people were employed by the agency/department on July 1st 2017 and April 30th 2018?

Answer.

1 July 2017

33 employees*

30 April 2018; 19 employees*

Total reduction of 14 employees can be attributed to the following.

5 employees permanently transferred to Department of Communities

3 employees permanently transferred to Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries.

1 employee permanently transferred to Department of Premier and Cabinet

4 employees resigned as a result of accepting offers under the Voluntary Targeted Separation Scheme (VTSS)

1 employee's fixed term contract came to a natural conclusion

2 How many Aboriginal people employed by the agency/department were Level 8 and above (including Senior Executive Service positions) on July 1st 2017 and April 30th 2018?

Answer:

1 July 2017. 3 employees* 30 April 2018, 1 employee*

Total reduction of 2 employees can be attributed to the following:

1 employee permanently transferred to Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries

1 employee permanently transferred to Department of Communities.
