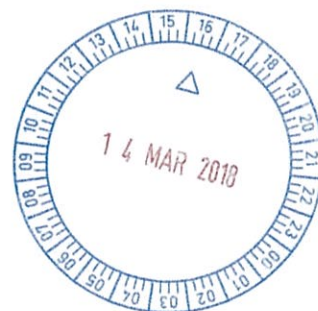

**Hon Diane Evers asked:**

- B2)** What was the rationale for the department for such significant increases in remuneration; and, following on from that, in the machinery-of-government changes how many of these key management personnel remain employed in the new department and are they at similar pay levels?

There was a restructure in late 2016 and all of a sudden we had a lot more highly paid people on staff at a time when royalties for regions was falling.  
Why is everybody getting paid more?

**Answer:**

The figures on page 51 represent the actual amounts paid to senior officers during the 2016 and 2017 financial years, rather than their annual compensation package. In many cases in 2016, the officers were not employed in their role for the full year, so only part of a full year's salary is shown. Some of these officers were subsequently paid a full year's salary in 2017. On this basis, there was no significant increase in remuneration to individual officers.

As at 16 February 2018 five of the officers employed in 2017 are now employed within the new department at a similar pay level.

**Hon Diane Evers asked:**

- B3)** I understand as of 20 January 2018 there have been 14 sub-catchments in the Warren and Donnelly Rivers that have been closed to further grants of licences from self-supply water users—I understand that is a water issue. This project is drawing on significant state and federal funds of \$70 million or more to take water from one group of users and subsidise this cost and provide the water to another group of users. I am just wondering how that is going to benefit the region, when it is simply taking it from some people and putting it somewhere else. In addition to that, I was wondering if there was a cost-benefit analysis done for this and if that could be tabled or provided at a later date. Also, I am interested in the processes that were involved to get a broad cross-section of the community in the development of the project.

The whole project, and was there a business case?

**Answer:**

The premise of the Southern Forests Irrigation Scheme is that water availability in cleared horticultural land is constrained. The Scheme will ensure sufficient water can be moved to where demand and productivity is greatest. With the scarcity of water increasing, the development of a closed pipe irrigation scheme is the most efficient way of using such a valuable resource.

The Southern Forests Irrigation Scheme is expected to create up to 225 new jobs in the local region by meeting the local industry expansion plans and supporting better management of drought periods by existing growers. It is estimated that that the Scheme will generate \$54 million of on farm developments and around \$103 million will be added to the economy annually.

A business case for the Southern Forests Irrigation Scheme, including a cost benefit analysis, was prepared by independent specialists. The methodology for the analysis was based on similar projects in Tasmania and was submitted to the Commonwealth Government as part of the application for funding. The analysis indicated that the public economic benefits of the project were more than double the cost.

The cost-benefit analysis forms part of the project business case which is being assessed by the Commonwealth Government. It is understood some of the information will be provided to the Commonwealth Cabinet prior to a decision being made. Therefore tabling the business case at this time may be contrary to

the operation of that jurisdiction's Cabinet process. Once a decision is made, and depending on the decision, tabling of the business case will be reviewed.

No existing water licenses will be impacted by this project.

Was the community involved in the planning for it and the development of it?

Answer:

Yes, the project has been industry led and has benefited from the oversight of a community based Steering Group established in 2015. The Warren Donnelly Water Advisory Committee has been regularly updated and the Chair of the Committee is a member of the Steering Group. Seven public workshops have been held to date and more are planned should the project go ahead, subject to Commonwealth funding.
