1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 10.00am pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Alanna Clohesy, took the Chair.

Prayers and an Acknowledgement of Country were read.

2. Select Committee into Disaster Resilience

Hon Martin Aldridge: To move on the next day of sitting —

- (1) A select committee to be known as the Disaster Resilience Select Committee is established.
- (2) The Select Committee is to inquire into and report on
 - (a) the increasing prevalence of natural disasters in Western Australia, risks posed to communities, infrastructure, the economy and the environment and the State's preparedness to meet these challenges;
 - (b) the capability of our government, non-government organisations and the private sector including service delivery models to surge capacity during peak periods of demand;
 - (c) the current model of recovery delivery in Western Australia, whether it is fit-for-purpose and lessons learnt from other jurisdictions and models; and
 - (d) to make recommendations to improve Western Australia's resilience to natural disasters now and into the future.
- (3) The Select Committee is to report no later than 12 months after the motion is agreed to.
- (4) The Select Committee shall consist of no fewer than three members.

3. Government Failure to Deliver Adequate Services

Non-Government Business No. 1 having been called, Hon Dr Steve Thomas moved, without notice —

That this House notes —

(a) the McGowan Government will announce another multi-billion dollar surplus today, thanks to rising State taxes, the high iron ore price and the GST floor put in place by the former Coalition Federal Government; and

(b) that despite this wealth the McGowan Government is still failing to deliver adequate services to the people of the State including in the areas of health, housing, regional development, tax reform and emergency response,

and calls on the Government to lift its performance for the benefit of the people of this great State rather than its own self-interest.
