[Petroleum Legislation Amendment Bill 2023](#)

(Minister for Mines and Petroleum) (No. 142)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Petroleum and Geothermal Energy Resources Act 1967*; and amend the *Petroleum Pipelines Act 1969*; and amend the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Act 1982*; and make related and consequential amendments to other Acts.

The purpose of the bill is to provide for the control and regulation of firearms and related things; and to repeal the *Firearms Act 1973*; and to make consequential and related amendments to other Acts.
