1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 10.00am pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Alanna Clohesy, took the Chair.

3. Standing Committee on Environment and Public Affairs — Report 60 — Petition No. 020 — Dog Act 1976

Hon Peter Foster presented Report 60 of the Standing Committee on Environment and Public Affairs, *Petition No. 020 — Dog Act 1979*. (Tabled Paper 1886).

4. Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review — Report 140 — Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Amendment Bill 2022

Hon Donna Faragher presented Report 140 of the Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review, *Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Amendment Bill 2022.* (Tabled Paper 1887).

5. City of Bayswater Keeping and Control of Cats Local Law/2022 — Disallowance

Hon Lorna Harper: To move on the next day of sitting —

That, pursuant to recommendation of the Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation, the *City of Bayswater Keeping and Control of Cats Local Law 2022* published in the *Gazette* on 7 October 2022 and tabled in the Council on 11 October 2022 under the *Local Government Act 1995*, be and is hereby disallowed. (Tabled Paper 1675).

6. Fines Enforcement Regime

Hon Pierre Yang: To move on the next day of sitting —

That this House notes the historic reform of Western Australia's fines enforcement regime during the last term of Government and commends the McGowan Government on the meaningful difference this reform has provided to those in our community who experience genuine hardship as a result of their inability to pay a fine. In particular, this House notes in relation to the reform —

- (a) the impact of the commencement of the work and development permit scheme;
- (b) the reduction in the number of individuals imprisoned as a result of fine defaulting;
- (c) the introduction of garnishee orders and their impact in recovering payment for outstanding fines; and
- (d) the prohibition of issuing licence suspension orders for individuals whose last known address is in a remote area, addressing the disproportionate impact of suspended licences on individuals living in remote areas without public transport infrastructure.

7. Failure of Government to Deliver for Children

Non-Government Business No. 1 having been called, Hon Nick Goiran moved, without notice — That this House —

- (a) expresses its grave concern that the McGowan Labor Government's failure to deliver for the children of Western Australia has left them abandoned in unsafe environments;
- (b) particularly notes
 - (i) a concerning spike in the number of children, in the care of our child protection system, who have been reported to police as a missing person;
 - (ii) the Premier's displays of arrogance and contempt towards the concerns expressed by experts following the crisis at Banksia Hill Juvenile Detention Centre;
 - (iii) the disproportionate impact on children of the Government's lack of competent action on housing and homelessness; and
- (c) calls on the Premier to ensure that his pending Cabinet reshuffle not only removes any unreliable, confused or confusing Ministers, but also introduces new Ministers who will ensure that the principle of the best interests of children is not treated like a slogan for media attention but instead as a paramount principle that must be delivered upon.

Debate ensued.

Motion lapsed.

8. Defence Force Veterans

Private Members' Business No. 1 having been called, Hon Dan Caddy moved, without notice — That this House acknowledge —

(a) the service of all Western Australian defence force veterans and serving personnel and their families;

- (b) the positive measures that have been taken by the McGowan Government to help our veterans, especially with respect to transition; and
- (c) the commitment of the McGowan Government to major memorial projects.

Debate ensued.

Motion lapsed.

9. Liquor Control Amendment (Protected Entertainment Precincts) Bill 2022
