1. Meeting of Council

2. Ministerial Statement — Asian Renewable Energy Hub

The Minister for Regional Development made a Ministerial Statement with respect to the environmental approval for the first stage of the Asian Renewable Energy Hub Project.

3. Recruiting Agricultural and Hospitality Skilled Workers in Regional Western Australia

Motion No. 3 having been called, Hon Colin de Grussa, pursuant to notice, moved —

That this House —

- (a) notes the current impact and future issues with recruiting agricultural and hospitality skilled workers in regional Western Australia;
- (b) calls on the State Government to provide transparency on its plans to ensure skilled workers in these sectors are available as soon as possible; and
- (c) discusses strategies to improve the availability and reliability of such workers to strengthen the resilience and populations of regional Western Australia.

Page 2, after line 10 — To insert:

(2) However, if the *Work Health and Safety Act 2019* Part 15 does not come into operation before the end of the period of 10 years beginning on assent day, this Act is repealed on the day after that period ends.

Requested amendment agreed to.

The Minister for Regional Development representing the Minister for Industrial Relations moved, without notice —

That a message be transmitted to the Legislative Assembly to request that the Legislative Assembly make the amendments requested by the Legislative Council at Clause 2 of the *Safety Levies Amendment Bill 2019*.

Debate ensued.

Question — put and passed.

The Minister for Regional Development representing the Minister for Industrial Relations moved, That the Chair report progress and seek to sit again.

The Work Health and Safety Bill 2019 reported with amendments, and amendments to the long title.

Page 2, line 7 — To insert after "Royal Assent":

(assent day)

Page 2, after line 10 — To insert:

(2) However, if the *Work Health and Safety Act 2019* Part 15 does not come into operation before the end of the period of 10 years beginning on assent day, this Act is repealed on the day after that period ends.
