FIRST SESSION OF THE FORTY-FIRST PARLIAMENT

THURSDAY, 12 MAY 2022

1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 am pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

An Acknowledgement of Country and Prayers were read.

2. Speaker's Statement – Budget Arrangements

The Speaker advised that Members' Statements would occur at 12.20 pm, Question Time would take place at 12.30 pm, and the Budget would be handed down at 2.00 pm today.

3. Brief Ministerial Statements

The Minister for Housing on the Housing Diversity Pipeline.

The Minister for Environment on nature-based tourism in Western Australia.

The Minister for Environment on the 50th anniversary of the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions 'bushfire aerial detection fleet'.
