NON-GOVERNMENT BUSINESS

1. Western Australian Hardwood Timber Industry

Hon Steve Martin to move —

That this House notes —

- (a) the loss of jobs and closure of businesses in the Western Australian hardwood timber industry in recent weeks as a result of the Labor Government's decision to shut down hardwood logging;
- (b) the Government's inability to provide a "just transition" for the workers and businesses impacted by the decision to end timber harvesting;
- (c) the failure of the Minister for Forestry and Government to adequately consult and listen to local communities that are being damaged during the transition process; and
- (d) the multitude of failures and problems the new Minister for Agriculture has inherited through a lack of support from the McGowan Government for the agricultural sector,

and calls on the Minister for Agriculture and Forestry to acquaint the Legislative Council with the details of her plans to fix the many issues the McGowan Government has inflicted on both industries.
