- (a) acknowledges the reality of climate change and calls on the Federal Government to take action to ensure Australia meets its obligations under the Paris Agreement; and
- (b) notes that climate change has increased the likelihood of extreme weather events including more regular and intense bushfires, and drought, and cause extreme disruption to Western Australia's biodiversity, coastlines, water and food security, economy, and to its people and their livelihoods.
