Page 30, after line 15 — To insert:

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38A. Section 89C inserted

Before section 90 insert:

89C. Participation in cultural support plan for Aboriginal child or Torres Strait Islander child

If a cultural support plan is required for an Aboriginal child or Torres Strait Islander child, the CEO must, subject to the regulations, give an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander representative organisation an opportunity to participate in the preparation of the cultural support plan for the child.

Clause 39.

The Minister for Child Protection moved,

Page 30, line 21 — To delete "approved".

Amendment put and passed.

Clause 39, as amended, agreed to.

Clauses 40 to 75 agreed to.

Title agreed to.

Consideration in detail concluded.

Ordered, That the third reading of the bill be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting of the Assembly.
