Misuse of Drugs Amendment Bill 2023

(Minister for Police) (No. 106)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Misuse of Drugs Act 1981.

Main Roads Amendment Bill 2023

(Minister for Transport) (No. 101)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Main Roads Act 1930.

Workers Compensation and Injury Management Bill 2023

(Minister for Industrial Relations) (No. 99)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for employers to be liable to compensate workers who suffer injuries from employment; and to establish a scheme for compulsory insurance against that liability; and to provide for the management of those injuries; and to provide for the resolution of disputes; and to make administrative and other related provisions; and to make consequential and related amendments to, and repeals of, various written laws.

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Workers Compensation and Injury Management Act 2023.

Appropriation (Capital 2023-24) Bill 2023

(Treasurer) (No. 109)

The purpose of this bill is to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Account certain sums for the capital purposes of the year ending 30 June 2024.
