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## **PRIVATE MEMBERS' BUSINESS – NOTICES OF MOTION**

### **1. Western Australia's Livestock Industry** (Notice given – 19/2/19, renewed – 6/8/19)

Mr I.C. Blayney: To move –

That this House:

- (1) Expresses its unequivocal support for Western Australia's livestock industry and the other industries associated with and reliant on a successful and vibrant livestock industry.
- (2) Condemns the actions of activists interfering with and interrupting businesses going about their legitimate business activities, contributing to the economy, creating jobs and supporting their local communities.

### **2. Tourism Industry Policies** (Notice given – 19/2/19, renewed – 6/8/19)

Ms L. Mettam: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government, and in particular the Minister for Tourism, for overseeing a collapse in the tourism sector which has been a direct consequence of the Government's failed policies.

### **3. Collie Coal Industry** (Notice given – 19/2/19, renewed – 6/8/19)

Mr D.C. Nalder: To move –

That this House condemns the Minister for Energy for abandoning the people of Collie by closing down the coal industry.

### **4. Privatisation of Public Assets** (Notice given – 19/2/19, renewed – 6/8/19)

Mr D.C. Nalder: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for its dishonesty prior to the State election by saying it opposed privatisation of public assets, and then subsequently selling a range of public assets following the election.

### **5. Major Transport Projects** (Notice given – 19/2/19, renewed – 6/8/19)

Mrs L.M. Harvey: To move –

That this House condemns the Minister for Transport for her bungling of major projects, including Metronet and the Huawei Radio Replacement Contract.

### **6. Federal Labor Opposition Policies** (Notice given – 20/3/19, renewed – 28/8/19)

Mr D.C. Nalder: To move –

That this House:

- (a) expresses its deep concern at the McGowan Government's support for the policies of the Federal Labor Opposition including their policies on negative gearing, franking credits, capital gains tax, a 50% renewable energy target and industrial relations; and
- (b) calls on the McGowan Government to explain the potential impact of these policies for Western Australians at a time of subdued housing, retail and employment sectors.

**7. Mortgage Stress and Negative Equity** (Notice given – 20/3/19, renewed – 28/8/19)

Mr D.C. Nalder: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for its poor judgement and the impact their decisions are having on Western Australian households, including their decisions to remove the First Home Owners Grant Boost, their introduction of a Foreign Buyers Surcharge and their increases to the cost of living, all of which have contributed to mortgage stress and negative equity.

**8. Frontline Services in Western Australia** (Notice given – 29/10/19)

Mrs L.M. Harvey: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for failing to properly deliver on frontline services across Western Australia, including health, education and law and order.

**9. Disallowance – *Petroleum and Geothermal Energy Resources (Hydraulic Fracturing) Amendment Regulations 2019*** (Notice given – 29/10/19)

Mr R.S. Love: To move –

That the *Petroleum and Geothermal Energy Resources (Hydraulic Fracturing) Amendment Regulations 2019*, a copy of which was laid upon the table of the House on Tuesday 17 September 2019, are hereby disallowed.

**10. Policy Direction – Agricultural Industry** (Notice given – 29/10/19)

Mr R.S. Love: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for its inaction and lack of policy direction for the agricultural industry including the future of live export, addressing animal activism, glyphosate use and water security and response to drought-like conditions affecting our State.

**11. Anti-Social Behaviour in Local Communities** (Notice given – 29/10/19)

Mr P.A. Katsambanis: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for failing to address out of control violence, theft and anti-social behaviour in local communities.

**12. Small Business Closures** (Notice given – 29/10/19)

Mrs A.K. Hayden: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for failing to adequately respond to the wave of small business closures across Western Australia.

**13. Delivery of Local Infrastructure Projects** (Notice given – 29/10/19)

Ms L. Mettam: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for failing to deliver on local infrastructure projects.

**14. Delays to Job Creating Infrastructure** (Notice given – 29/10/19)

Ms L. Mettam: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for axing Roe 8/9 which would create 10,000 direct and indirect jobs and for putting its foot on the hose of job-creating infrastructure, including Metronet rail lines which are yet to commence or create a single job.

**15. Western Australia's Economy** (Notice given – 29/10/19)

Mr D.C. Nalder: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for failing to stimulate the WA economy in the context of a domestic economic recession and windfall gains from the GST-fix, high iron ore prices and the privatisation of State's assets.

**16. Western Australia's Domestic Economy – Housing Sector** (Notice given – 29/10/19)

Mr S.K. L'Estrange: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for failing to properly grow the domestic economy of WA and turn around the longest and deepest housing sector decline in recent history.

Mr W.R. Marmion: To move –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for forcing State Government responsibilities onto local governments, thereby shifting costs onto struggling Western Australian ratepayers.

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government's woefully inadequate response to the homelessness crisis.

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for failing to address the Meth crisis which it promised to do at the last State election.

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for its attack on the housing industry, home values and construction jobs, including reducing demand by introducing the foreign investment tax and cuts to the first home owner grant boost.

**2. McGowan Government's First Two Parliamentary Years** (Moved – 28/11/18)

Adjourned debate (Ms L. Mettam – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Dr M.D. Nahan –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for its failures in delivering on its election promises, cuts to frontline services, cost of living increases and failure to be open and accountable to the people of Western Australia in its first two parliamentary years.

**3. Frontline Services and the Western Australia Community** (Moved – 20/2/19)

Adjourned debate (Mr K.M. O'Donnell – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr S. L'Estrange –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for its cuts to frontline services, resulting in the WA community and frontline staff being put at risk

**4. Decision Making Processes of the McGowan Government** (Moved – 13/3/19)

Adjourned debate (Ms M.J. Davies – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Ms M.J. Davies –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for its disdain and neglect of regional Western Australia during its first two years in power through its metro-centric attitude and mean-spirited decision making processes.

**5. Impact of a Federal Labor Government on Western Australia** (Moved – 20/3/19)

Adjourned debate (Dr D.J. Honey – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Dr M.D. Nahan –

That this House notes the damage that a Federal Labor Government will have on Western Australia, including increases to the cost of living, reduced income for seniors and damage to the housing and construction sector.

**6. Federal Labor's Policies and Western Australia** (Moved – 3/4/19)

Adjourned debate (Ms J.J. Shaw – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Dr M.D. Nahan –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for its failure to stand up to Bill Shorten and Federal Labor who are advocating policies that will have a detrimental impact on Western Australia.

**7. Royalties for Regions** (Moved – 10/4/19)

Adjourned debate (Mr V.A. Catania – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr V.A. Catania –

That this House calls on the McGowan Government to restore the integrity of Royalties for Regions and to bring down a budget next month that will meet the real needs of people in regional Western Australia.

**8. Management of the Economy** (Moved – 8/5/19)

Adjourned debate (Minister for Mines and Petroleum – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr D.C. Nalder –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government's handling of the economy and its economy destroying policies that have seen a domestic economy in decline, a record number of Western Australians without jobs, record levels of mortgage stress, falling house prices, record levels of negative equity experienced by home owners, record levels of utility disconnections, a collapse in building approvals and falling retail trade.

**9. Live Sheep Export Industry** (Moved – 15/5/19)

Adjourned debate (Minister for Local Government – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Ms M.J. Davies –

That this House condemns Bill Shorten and the Federal Labor Party for its destructive plan to shut down WA's live sheep export industry and calls on the McGowan Government to stand up and fight to save an industry which generates hundreds of jobs in Western Australia.

**10. Election of the Morrison Government** (Moved – 12/6/19)

Adjourned debate (Mr W.R. Marmion – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Dr M.D. Nahan –

That this House notes the critical role the Premier had in the election of the Morrison Government, in particular, his failure to deliver jobs, his mean-spirited increases to cost of living, the small business crisis and falling house prices.

**11. Western Australia's Agricultural Sector** (Moved – 19/6/19)

Adjourned debate (Minister for Local Government – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr R.S. Love –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for deliberately deceiving Western Australia's agricultural sector by claiming it is delivering \$131.5 million of new money into agricultural capability within the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.

**12. Government Fees and Expenditure** (Moved – 26/6/19)

Adjourned debate (Dr A.D. Buti – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr W.R. Marmion –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for increases of \$850 per year to electricity prices, water prices, and car registration while taxpayers' money is being wasted on travel rorts, ministerial double-dipping, cosy union deals, talkfests and other ill-conceived government expenditure.

**13. Western Australia Country Medical Services** (Moved – 7/8/19)

Adjourned debate (Mr D.T. Punch – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Ms M.J. Davies –

That this House expresses its grave concern about the medical crisis in country Western Australia and the lack of resources and priority for country health.

**14. McGowan Government Law and Order** (Moved – 14/8/19)

Adjourned debate (Mrs L.M. Harvey – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr P.A. Katsambanis –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for its soft approach to law and order.

That this House condemns the divided McGowan Labor Government for failing to deliver on its jobs bonanza and for implementing policy decisions that have damaged the economy and inflicted financial pain on Western Australia's struggling households.

**16. Safety of the Western Australian Community** (Moved – 4/9/19)

Adjourned debate (Mr A. Krsticevic – continuation or remarks) on the motion moved by Mr P.A. Katsambanis –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for failing to protect the community of Western Australia.

**17. Western Australia's Health System** (Moved – 18/9/19)

Adjourned debate (Minister for Health – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr Z.R.F. Kirkup –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for being asleep at the wheel when it comes to managing Western Australia's struggling health system.

**18. Regional Health** (Moved – 25/9/19)

Adjourned debate (Minister for Health – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Ms M.J. Davies –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government's ongoing failure to prioritise investment in regional health.

**19. McGowan Labor Government Fiscal Policies** (Moved – 16/10/19)

Adjourned debate (Mr D.T. Punch – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr D.C. Nalder –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for its failed fiscal policy settings which are causing ongoing damage to the Western Australian economy, including strongly negative State Final Demand last financial year.

**20. Western Australia's Housing Sector** (Moved – 23/10/19)

Adjourned debate (Minister for Housing – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr D.C. Nalder –

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for plunging the housing sector into its longest and deepest crisis and calls on the Premier to immediately backflip on his ill-conceived Foreign Buyers Tax and migration changes.

**21. Southern Rangelands – Drought Response** (Moved – 30/10/19)

Adjourned debate (Minister for Water – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr V.A. Catania –

That this House calls on the Premier to implement an immediate response to the drought crisis affecting the Southern Rangelands in order to mitigate the enormous toll inaction is having on animal welfare, pastoralists and regional communities.

**22. South West Tourism - Job Opportunities** (Moved – 13/11/19)

Adjourned debate (Leader of the House) on the motion moved by Mr D.T. Redman –

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for risking job opportunities in the South West tourism and small business sectors by actively opposing the development of a new terminal building at the Busselton-Margaret River Airport.

**23. Glyphosate – Western Australia’s Agricultural Sector** (Moved – 13/11/19)

Adjourned debate (Mr D.R. Michael) on the motion moved by Mr P.J. Rundle –

That this House calls on the State Government to support Australian and global science backing the safe use of glyphosate for Western Australia’s agriculture sector.

**24. Mid West Communities – Standard of Health Services** (Moved – 13/11/19)

Adjourned debate (Minister for Health – continuation of remarks) on the motion moved by Mr R.S. Love –

That this House calls on the McGowan Government to deliver an acceptable standard of health services to Mid West communities such as Leeman, Greenhead, Mullewa and Dongara.
