SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

The following synopsis of Bills dealt with by the Legislative Assembly this week, is intended only to give a brief outline of the purpose of each Bill at the second reading stage of the Bill and the stages it was dealt with in the Legislative Assembly.

Land Tax Assessment Amendment (Build-to-Rent) Bill 2023

(Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Finance) (No. 112)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Land Tax Assessment Act 2002*.

Second reading, debated and agreed.

Consideration in detail and amended.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council.

Perth Parking Management Bill 2023

(Minister for Transport) (No. 123)

The purpose of this bill is to provide for licensing and authorising of parking spaces in the parking management area in the metropolitan region to manage parking; and to provide that licence fees and other revenue under this Act may be used to improve transport, accessibility, economic activity or urban amenity for the benefit of the parking management area; and to repeal the *Perth Parking Management Act 1999*, the *Perth Parking Management (Taxing) Act 1999*; and to make a consequential amendment to the *Sentencing Act 1995*; and for related purposes.

Second reading debated cognately with Perth Parking Management Amendment Bill 2023 and adjourned.

Perth Parking Management Amendment Bill 2023

(Minister for Transport) (No. 124)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Perth Parking Management Act 2023*.

Legal Deposit Amendment Bill 2023

(Minister for Culture and the Arts) (No. 104)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Legal Deposit Act 2012*.

Duties Amendment (Off-the-Plan Concession and Foreign Persons Exemptions) Bill 2023

(Treasurer) (No. 122)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Duties Act 2008*.

Introduced and read a first time.

Criminal Investigation Amendment (Protection of Law Enforcement Animals) Bill 2023

(Minister for Police) (No. 128)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Criminal Investigation Act 2006*.

Introduced and read a first time.

Electricity Industry Amendment (Distributed Energy Resources) Bill 2023

(Minister for Energy) (No. 127)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Electricity Industry Act 2004* in relation the State electricity objective, distributed energy resources and the regulation of network access, distribution networks and power system security, and to make consequential amendments to other Acts.
