Guardianship and Administration Amendment (Medical Research) Bill 2023

(Minister for Police) (No. 105)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Criminal Investigation Act 2006.

Bill introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech debated and agreed.

Consideration in Detail.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council.

Nickel (Agnew) Agreement Amendment Bill 2023

(Minister for State Development, Jobs and Trade) (No. 96)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Nickel (Agnew) Agreement Act 1974.

Bill introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered, debate adjourned.

Directors' Liability Reform Bill 2022

(Attorney General) (No. 89)

The purpose of this bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* and various other Acts in relation to the criminal liability of directors and other persons involved in the management of bodies corporate, and for related purposes.

Consideration in detail of Legislative Council Message No. 91.

Amendments agreed to and the Legislative Council acquainted accordingly.

Workers Compensation and Injury Management Bill 2023

(Minister for Industrial Relations) (No. 99)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for employers to be liable to compensate workers who suffer injuries from employment; and to establish a scheme for compulsory insurance against that liability; and to provide for the management of those injuries; and to provide for the resolution of disputes; and to make administrative and other related provisions; and to make consequential and related amendments to, and repeals of, various written laws.

Second reading debated and agreed.

Workers Compensation and Injury Management Amendment Bill 2023

(Minister for Industrial Relations) (No. 100)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Workers Compensation and Injury Management Act 2023.

Second reading debated and adjourned.

Misuse of Drugs Amendment Bill 2023

(Minister for Police) (No. 106)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Misuse of Drugs Act 1981.

Bill introduced and read a first time.
