Family Court Amendment Bill 2022

(Attorney General) (No. 66)

Bush Fires Amendment Bill 2022

(Minister for Environment) (No. 73)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Bush Fires Act 1954*.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered, debate adjourned.

Health Services Amendment Bill 2021

(Minister for Health) (No. 34)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Health Services Act 2016*; and the *Mental Health Act 2014*; and the *Motor Vehicle (Catastrophic Injuries) Act 2016*; and the *Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre Act 1966*; and the *University Medical School, Teaching Hospitals, Act 1955*.
