6518. Mr R.S. Love to the Minister for Health:

- (1) With reference to Question on Notice No. 5445, regarding Mobile Dental Health Clinic Services no longer available at Kalannie Primary School, what is the minimum number of students necessary for a school to retain a Mobile Dental Health Clinic and what was the process to arrive at this minimum number?
- (2) How will Kalannie Primary School students access this service, as they may reside 100 kilometres from the Dalwallinu service and who will bear the cost?
- (3) How will Kalannie Primary School manage the disruption to class, noting that there will be appointments with the mobile dental service for individual siblings for assessment and then treatment?
- (4) Which other schools in Moore are losing the Mobile Dental Health Clinic Service?

6519. Mr W.R. Marmion to the Minister for Transport; Planning:

I refer to the current plans for the Thornlie to Cockburn Central rail upgrade project, and ask:

- (a) can the Minister advise if consideration was given to providing pedestrian and/or cyclists direct access to Canning Vale Industrial Estate from the rear of Waratah Estate by way of either an underpass or bridge; and
- (b) can the Minister advise what route cyclists and pedestrians would take to access the Canning Vale Industrial from Waratah Estate?

6520. Mr R.S. Love to the Minister for Water:

- (1) Please detail the pricing structure for water at all schools in the electorate of Moore?
- (2) Can the Minister explain the variation in charges to different schools?
- (3) Has the Minister considered a cap to the cost of water to regional schools?
- (4) Schools such as Dalwallinu District High School (K-12) have no water to irrigate a school oval, limiting the Physical Education and recreational options for students:

(a) can the Minister outline any funding opportunities to enable schools such as Dalwallinu DHS to deliver water for the garden and grounds, other than through the Water Corporation Scheme supply?

- (1) In relation to recent amendments to the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* regarding declaration of Environmentally Sensitive Areas (ESA) through regulation, I ask:
 - (a) in drafting new regulations regarding ESAs what consultation will occur regarding the form of the regulations:
 - (i) with whom will that consultation occur?
- (2) Will new Regulations be finalised and gazetted before letters are sent to land owners who have an ESA on their property:
 - (a) and if yes, will the Regulations be included with the letter?
- (3) Will the Minister or the Department be seeking to declare every existing ESA under the new regulations:
 - (a) if not will landowners who will no longer be affected by an ESA be notified of that?
