# 5. Rights of Nature and Future Generations Bill 2019

Hon Diane Evers: To move on the next day of sitting —

# 6. Petroleum and Geothermal Energy Resources (Hydraulic Fracturing) Amendment Regulations 2019 — Disallowance

#### 7. Greenhouse Gas Emissions

- (c) recognises that on balance the cumulative impact on the environment is simply too great to justify proceeding and calls on the Government to instead prioritise the creation and retention of ongoing jobs in clean and renewable energy industries.

#### 8. Water Security

That this House acknowledges the important issue of water security in our State, and calls on the Government to investigate the feasibility of constructing a pipeline from the North of the State to supply water to the South.
