

NON-GOVERNMENT BUSINESS

1. Information Security Controls

Hon Wilson Tucker to move that the House —

- (a) expresses its dismay at the apparent disregard for appropriate information security controls, and the irresponsible handling of sensitive data, by State government agencies;
- (b) notes that repeated and consistent breaches of private data by State government agencies is eroding trust in government institutions;
- (c) notes that the *Privacy Act 1988* does not apply to State government agencies;
- (d) notes that Western Australia's privacy legislation is not fit for purpose; and
- (e) calls on the Government to implement State-based privacy legislation with all haste.

2. Resource Companies Windfall Profits and Royalty Rates

Hon Wilson Tucker to move that the House —

- (a) notes that due to high commodity prices resource companies are making windfall profits;
- (b) further notes that despite the super-profits made by private interests, the royalty paid to Western Australia is relatively low;
- (c) recognises that many Western Australians are struggling due to high inflation and a rising cost of living; and
- (d) calls on the Government to increase the royalty rate of commodities, ensuring a more equitable royalty is paid during periods of higher commodity prices, with revenue raised to be used to alleviate the increased cost of living for Western Australian residents.
