1. Meeting of Council

3. Road Traffic Amendment (Keeping Safe Distances from Bicycles) Bill 2014

Non-Government Business No. 1 having been called, Hon Lynn MacLaren, pursuant to notice, moved —

That a Bill for "An Act to amend the *Road Traffic Act 1974*." be introduced and read a first time.
