PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

On behalf of the Board, I am pleased to present the Annual Report for the year ended 30 June 2008.

The Board has had another busy year with monthly meetings being of 5-6 hours duration with preparation time approximately the same. I sincerely thank my fellow Board members, Ms Marie Matthews, consumer representative, Ms Maree Crouch, legal representative, and Dr's Holly Edwards, Graeme Ewers, Michael McGuinness and David Neesham for their dedication to serve. Considerable additional time has been spent by members at SAT assisting with serious matters and reviewing cases. The Registrar, Mr. Wayne Clark and his staff at HLB Mann Judd continue to assist the Board with administration and secretarial support.

An exceptional effort was made by the Registrar's office and Ms Kylie Reichelt in assisting the Board host the 25th Conference of Dental Board Presidents and Registrars, held at the Sheraton on the 17th August 2007. It was a great honor to Chair the Conference and assist with the very valuable outcomes that were achieved. The last time Perth hosted this event was the 15th Conference in 1990. The 26th Conference was held in Sydney on the 9th August 2008 and the 27th Conference will again be in Perth on the 11th March 2009, just prior to the 33rd Australian Dental Congress and Exhibition.

It is important to acknowledge the assistance offered by all external parties to the Board, especially the Board's Lawyers, government agencies such as the Legal & Legislative Services Division of the Department of Health, the State Administrative Tribunal (SAT) and others including but not limited to the Executive of ADA (WA Branch), the Australian Dental Council, the other six State/Territory Dental Boards and the New Zealand Dental Council.

Unfortunately, progression of the Dental Bill 2005 stalled in the Upper House and with the State Election called, the Bill has now lapsed. However the Board continues to develop policy and guidelines in preparation for refining the Regulations and Rules to support a very much needed new Act. The Dental Act 1939 in many areas is out of step with the other Australian Dental Acts and the Community's and the Profession's modern expectations.

Registration (license) fees and other Board fees were increased from the 1st January 2006. They have not increased since this date and the Board continues to function well with the fees generated. Board members receive approximately 5% of the Board's annual income. No fee increase will occur in 2009 and no increase is anticipated for 2010.

Recently, considerable informal discussion has occurred on increasing the number and amounts of Awards the Board supports within the profession and the community. It is intended to formalize these discussions during the next reporting year.

Failure to pay registration fees

The Board is pleased that the number of Registrants who failed to renew their licenses, yet continued to practise, decreased considerably this year. The failure to renew often results from failing to advise the Registrar's office of a change in address on moving residence or traveling overseas for an extended period or in the case of female registrants, maternity leave. On removal from the Register, which usually happens early in each calendar year, the Board's policy is to advise the Health Insurance Commission which controls the provision of provider numbers and major Health Funds. This is after the Australian Dental Association, the Dental Therapy and Hygiene Association and Dental Health Services have been advised.

Dentist removals from the register for non renewal were 14 this year, The record for past years is 2007, (24), 2006, (84), 2005, (60), 2004, (61); 2003, (5); 2002, (20); 2001, (33) and 2000 (21).

Of increasing concern this year was the number of Dental Hygienists, Dental Therapists and School Dental Therapists, practicing without a license. As this group do not have Provider numbers, do not directly invoice the public or Health Funds and have a low membership rate in their Associations, they simply disappear until detected by complaints to the Board or following enquiry by employers.

Employers / supervisors are responsible for ensuring their employees are registered. Several Registrants have been prosecuted in the Magistrates Court which has handed down fines ranging from \$150-\$400, plus significant costs, but by far the most important aspect is that these individuals now have a criminal record unless the Magistrate records it as "spent".

Although re-registration with the Board is a formality in most cases, this may affect you in many other ways such as insurance policy declarations for Professional Indemnity and other Insurances, overseas travel (visa applications etc), standing for Parliament or sitting on Government Boards or bodies.

The Board considers these to be very serious matters and an unacceptable and unnecessary risk to the public of Western Australia.

Records

The poor quality of dental record keeping continues to disappoint the Board. The standard of records is often a supplementary matter when allegations of Professional Misconduct have been made. Poor records are careless at best, but incompetent if endemic in the Registrant's practise of dentistry. Record keeping has been previously raised in my President's Addresses in 2000, 2001, 2005 and now again in 2008. All Australian Dental Registration Boards work on the principle "if it is not written/recorded, it didn't happen".

Some of the record keeping deficiencies observed by the Board include:

- failure to record clinical findings;
- failure to record general and periodontal charting;
- failure to assess the occlusion in complex Prosthodontic and Orthodontic cases;
- failure to record alternate treatment options;
- minimal evidence of attempts at providing informed consent
- absence of essential maintenance protocols;
- medical histories non existent or considerably out of date; and
- failure to record details of materials used, local anesthetic and antibiotic prescriptions.

These record keeping practises are often just the tip of the problem. Poor records often go hand in hand with poor diagnosis and case assessment and standard of subsequent treatment.

For the first time that I can remember, this year a dentist was found guilty of incompetence in respect of his record keeping, case assessment, treatment plan and management of the Patient's complex dental problem. This is detailed further in the cases report later in this Report.

National Registration System

The proposal by the Council of Australian Governments to implement a system of national registration and accreditation is a likely scenario, starting with national registration from the 1st July 2010. There are many well written articles in circulation, proffering comment and progression of this ideal as suggested by the National Productivity Commission.

I believe it is essential registrants continually familiarize themselves with their obligations under the Dental Act and not wait for Board action to be required. Registrants and Dentists who employ auxiliaries should regularly visit the Board's website at http://www.dentalboard.wa.gov.au to ensure they are registered; their employees are registered and respond to any recent Dental Alerts that may be listed.

I commend the Report.

3. INQUIRIES

3.1 State Administrative Tribunal

Disciplinary matters that have the potential to result in a practitioner being suspended or struck off the Register are required to be referred by the Board to the State Administrative Tribunal (SAT). Additionally, in respect of lesser matters, a practitioner can elect for the SAT to hear a matter rather than the matter being dealt with by the Board under the disciplinary powers given to the Board in the Dental Act 1939. (Refer to 3.2 below). The penalties that can be imposed by the SAT are similar to the penalties that can be imposed by the Board with the exception being that the SAT can order that a practitioner be suspended from or struck off the Register. The Board does not have the power to Order that a practitioner be suspended from or struck off the Register.

Two matters were referred to SAT during the year ended 30 June 2008 and were not finalised by that date.

3. INQUIRIES (CONT'D)

3.2 Matters dealt with by the Board under the Board's "Informal Inquiry" powers

Under Section 30 of the Dental Act 1939, where the Board is of the opinion that a proceeding before the State Administrative Tribunal is not warranted by the nature of the allegations, the Board may deal with the matter, provided the Board has afforded the person concerned the option of the matter being heard before the State Administrative Tribunal. The Board may deal with the matter by imposing one or more of the following penalties:

- Censure;
- Impose conditions limiting practise;
- Impose a fine of up to \$2,500; and
- Require the dentist to contribute towards the costs of the proceedings.

The Board dealt with the following matters on this basis during the year.

3.3 Other - practicing whilst unregistered

The Board initiated prosecution proceedings during the year in the Magistrates Court in respect of a dental practitioner who practised whilst unregistered. The practitioner was fined \$150 and ordered to pay costs of \$110.20. The Board's policy is to initiate such actions against any dentist or auxiliary who practises whilst unregistered. The Board draws practitioners' attention to the matter that practicing whilst unregistered may jeopardise a practitioner's insurance cover.

4. COUNSELLING SESSIONS

Where there is insufficient evidence for the Board to deal with a matter or refer the matter to the State Administrative Tribunal pursuant to Section 30 of the Act but there are grounds for the counselling of the practitioner in relation to the practitioner's professional conduct, the Board will arrange for the dentist to be counselled.

During the year ended 30 June 2008, the Board conducted 3 counselling sessions.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Dental Act 1939.

The financial report covers the Dental Board of Western Australia as an individual entity. The Board is incorporated in Western Australia under the Dental Act 1939. The financial report was authorised for issue on 19 November 2007.

The following is a summary of the basis of preparation and the material accounting policies adopted by the Board in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of Preparation

The financial report of the Dental Board of Western Australia as an individual entity complies with all Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS) in their entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, and financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

Accounting Policies

a) Income and Expense Recognition

Licence fees are brought to account as income on a time expiry basis under the accruals method of accounting.

Inquiry costs recoverable are brought to account as income in the financial year in which the Board issues a notice to a registered Dentist under which any Inquiry costs are recoverable.

Expenses are brought to account under the accruals method of accounting in the year incurred.

b) Taxation

The income of the Dental Board of Western Australia is exempt from tax pursuant to Section 24AQ of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

c) Goods and Services Tax

Revenue and expenditure is stated net of the amount of the goods and services tax (GST).

d) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

At the reporting date, if interest rates had been 50 basis points higher or lower and all other variables were held constant, the Boards net surplus for the year ended 30 June 2008 and net assets as at that date would have increased or reduced by approximately \$4,156 respectively (2007: \$3,588).

d) Credit Risk

The maximum exposure to credit risk, excluding the value of any collateral or other security, at balance date to recognised financial assets is the carrying amount, net of any allowances for impairment, as disclosed in the balance sheet and notes to the financial statements.

The Board does not have any material credit risk exposure to any single debtor or group of debtors under financial instruments entered into by the Board.

e) Liquidity Risk

The Board manages liquidity risk by monitoring forecast cash flows and ensuring that adequate cash funds are maintained.

f) Net Fair Values

The aggregate net fair values and carrying amounts of financial assets and financial liabilities are disclosed in the balance sheet and in the notes to the financial statements.
