	Management Area	Recovery Strategy Outlined in Allocation Plan
1	Carnarvon Ground Water (GW)Area	Unused water entitlements will be reviewed every three years as per <i>Statewide policy no. 11 - Management of unused licensed water entitlements</i> until licensed entitlements are reduced to within the allocation limit.
2	Gingin Surface Water (SW) Area	Allocation limits have been capped at use or 10% below current entitlements for surface water resources in Gingin. As a result no new water will be allocated. In areas where the allocation limit is 10% below entitlements, unused entitlements will be recouped as per <i>Statewide policy no. 11 - Management of unused licensed water entitlements</i> through the licence renewal process. Efficiency and compliance are also prioritised in these areas.
3	Gnangara GW Area	Allocation limits in the superficial aquifer (the mound) were on average reduced by 13% and in the confined aquifer were reduced to 10% below entitlements. As a
