- Nurses in mental health positions were selected using mental health cost centres and includes all types of nurses working in mental health areas, including agency nurses, but excluding Assistants in Nursing.
- The WACHS Specialist Aboriginal Mental Health Services (SAMHS) is a fully integrated model employing Aboriginal staff to work within WACHS Public mental health services.
- The Kimberley SAMHS model differs as there is a partnership between the WACHS Kimberley Mental Health Drug Service and the Kimberley Aboriginal Medical Service Council.
- In addition to the above nursing positions, there are 30 Aboriginal Mental Health Worker (AMHW) FTE funded for WACHS SAMHS. These include coordinators and senior workers with the majority being 50D positions. As at 29 February 2012, 21.25 FTEs were in place. A Senior Project Officer is also employed to coordinate program implementation.
- The Statewide Specialist Aboriginal Mental Health Service includes Metropolitan services, including a central unit that provides statewide services that are not included in this response. The North Metropolitan Area Health Service manages this program.
