PROPOSAL FOR THE PARTIAL REVOCATION OF
STATE FOREST NO. 7, 14, 20 AND 56

WHEREAS by Orders in Council published in the Government Gazette areas of Crown land were dedicated as State forest to be known as State forest no. 7, 14, 20 and 56.

AND WHEREAS it is now desirable to revoke in part the dedication of those State forests.


I do, therefore, with the advice and the consent of the Executive Council, propose to the Parliament of Western Australia that the dedication of Crown land as State forest no. 7, 14, 20 and 56 be revoked in part by excising the areas described in the Schedule to this proposal.

SCHEDULE

AREA NO.	STATE FOREST NO.	DESCRIPTION
1	7	An area of 9.377 hectares situated about five kilometres south of Mundaring and comprising Lot 375 on Diagram 6300 and Lot 376 on Plan 4109. On Landgate plan: Mundaring SW (2134-III-SW).
2	14	An area of 1.8121 hectares situated about 1½ kilometres south-east of Dwellingup and comprising Lot 555 on Deposited Plan 60421. On Landgate plans: BG 32 (2) 26.20 and BG 32 (10) 6.4.
3	20	An area of 3.597 hectares situated about five kilometres south-east of Balingup as shown on Main Roads Western Australia Drawing 200802-0191. On Landgate plan: Bridgetown NW (2130-III-NW).
4	56	A total area of 18.3141 hectares situated between two to six kilometres north of Margaret River and comprising Lots 511 to 516 on Deposited Plan 73073. On Landgate plan: Cowaramup (1930-III-SW).
