Voluntary school fee contributions for children in the care of the Department for Child Protection and Family Support's Chief Executive Officer

The Department of Education currently requests voluntary contributions towards the cost of materials, services and facilities used by students enrolled in kindergarten to year 10.

While the Department for Child Protection and Family Support (the Department) remains committed to supporting children in care to meet their academic potential, it is the Department's intention to cease paying voluntary school fee contributions to schools from the start of 2014.

As part of your agency's commitment to the Rapid Response Framework to prioritise services and supports to children and young people in care, it is requested that the Department of Education supports the non-payment of voluntary contributions for children in care enrolled in kindergarten to year 10 by advising school principals of the proposed changes.
