Hon Alanna Clohesy to the Parliamentary Secretary representing the Minister for Health

I refer to needle and syringe exchange programs in Western Australia, and I ask:

- 1. What organisations offer this service in WA?
- 2. For each organisation, how much State Government funding does each receive per year?
- 3. In which specific locations in WA is this service offered?

I thank the honourable member for some notice of this question. The following information has been provided to me by the Minister for Health.

(1-2) The WA Substance User's Association receives \$1,115,841.

The WA AIDS Council receives \$270,998. The Needle and Syringe Exchange Programs (NSEP) service is only part of the comprehensive services provided by the WA AIDS Council.

The South Metropolitan Community Drug Services Team Palmerston receives \$29,980.

The Community Drug Services Team (Midwest) receives \$53,800.

The WA Department of Health receives \$1,393,870. This includes regional coordinators (\$511,370) and the funding of needle and syringes and disposal costs (\$882,500)




