Hon Kate Doust to the Minister for Disability Services.

- 1. Can the Minister confirm that Disability Services is currently employing 90 to 100 disability support workers through the Labour Hire firm Ranstad at a monthly cost of \$750,000, and if yes:
 - a. How long will these Labour Hire disability support workers be employed by the agency?
 - b. How much money has the Department paid to Ranstad
- 2. How many employees in total does the Department of Disability Services employ through Labour Hire firms?
- 3. How much money does the department spend a month on Labour Hire firms?

I thank the Hon. Member for some notice of this question.

- 1. The Commission is currently employing 74 disability support workers at an approximate cost of \$600,000, however this fluctuates month to month.
 - (a) This is still to be determined as the accommodation transition process progresses, however the use of Labour Hire disability support workers is foreseeable at least for the next 12 months.
 - (b) The Disability Services Commission has paid \$2.5m to Ranstad from 1 July 2014 to 31 October 2014.
- 2. The Disability Services Commission currently employs 94 employees through Labour Hire firms.
- 3. The Disability Services Commission has spent approximately \$795,000 a month on Labour Hire from July to October 2014.
