C1088. Hon Dr Steve Thomas to the Minister for Regional Development

I refer to the Collie Industry Attraction and Development Fund ("the fund"), and I ask:

- 1. What is the total amount that has been made available under this fund since its inception?
- 2. What is the balance of unallocated or uncommitted monies remaining in the fund?
- 3. What projects have received funding from the fund and to what value each? and
- 4. What new full time, part-time and casual positions have been created within each project funded in part 2?

Answer

- 1. \$78.1 million
- 2. The total allocation for publically announced projects under the Collie Industry Attraction and Development Fund is \$40.74 million, noting that a number of applications for funding are currently under consideration.
- 3. Projects supported:
 - Koolinup Emergency Service Centre nearly \$14million
 - Collie Emergency Services Vehicle Manufacturing \$2.5million
 - The Wellington Dam Mural has been an extraordinary success bringing people into town in great numbers.
