FISH RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 1994
PROHIBITION ON FISHING (WIRE TRACE) ORDER 2022
Order No.7 of 2022

Made by the Minister under section 43.

1. Citation

This order is the *Prohibition on Fishing (Wire Trace) Order 2022*.

2. Interpretation

In this order—

wire trace means a length of steel or metal wire or chain that is attached to, or is part of, a fishing line, but does not include hooks, swivels, or sinkers.

3. Prohibition

A person must not fish from the shore in the area described in the Schedule by the use of a wire trace.

Schedule

All Western Australian waters bounded by a line commencing at a point at 32° 01.295' south latitude and 115° 45.138' east longitude (on the mainland); then extending due west along the parallel to a point at 32° 01.295' south latitude and 115° 44.53' east longitude; then southerly along the geodesic to a point at 32° 02.47' south latitude and 115° 43.97' east longitude; then due east along the parallel to a point at 32° 02.47' south latitude and 115° 44.15' east longitude (on the mainland); then generally easterly and northerly along the high water mark to the commencement point.

All Western Australian waters bounded by a line commencing at a point at 32° 01.295' south latitude and 115° 45.138' east longitude (on the mainland); then extending due west along the parallel to a point at 32° 01.295' south latitude and 115° 44.53' east longitude; then southerly along the geodesic to a point at 32° 02.47' south latitude and 115° 43.97' east longitude; then due east along the parallel to a point at 32° 02.47' south latitude and 115° 44.15' east longitude (on the mainland); then generally easterly and northerly along the high water mark to the commencement point.
