SUBMISSION TO PARLIAMENT UNDER SECTIONS 44(1) OF THE LAND ADMINISTRATION ACT 1997

The proposal detailed in this report is required by the above provisions to be laid before each House of Parliament.

Section 43 of the Land Administration Act 1997 provides as follows:

- 43(1) If, after a proposal is laid before each House of Parliament under sections 42(4), 44(1) or 45(4) notice of a resolution disallowing the proposal
 - (a) is not given in either House of Parliament within 14 sitting days of that House after the proposal was laid before it, the proposed reduction, excision, cancellation, change, grant or permission may be implemented by order after the last day of the later of those periods of 14 sitting days; or
 - (b) is given in either or both of the Houses of Parliament within 14 sitting days of that House, or each of those Houses, after the proposal was laid before it, but that resolution is not lost in that House or each of those Houses within 30 sitting days after the proposal was laid before it, the proposed reduction, excision, cancellation, change, grant or permission lapses; or
 - (c) is given in either or both of the Houses of Parliament within 14 sitting days of that House, or each of those Houses, after the proposal was laid before it, but that resolution is lost in that House or each of those Houses within 30 sitting days after the proposal was laid before it, the proposed reduction, excision, cancellation, change, grant or permission may be implemented by order after that loss or after the later of those losses, as the case requires.
- (2) It does not matter whether or not a number of sitting days referred to in subsection (1) or some of them occur during
 - (a) the same session of Parliament; or
 - (b) the same Parliament.

EASEMENT IN CLASS 'A' RESERVE 18324 UNDER SECTION 44(1) OF THE LAND ADMINISTRATION ACT 1997 (LAA)

Class 'A' Reserve 18324, being Yokine Reginal Open Space, is set aside for the purpose of 'Recreation' and managed by the City of Stirling.

The Water Corporation manage a drainage pumping station and associated infrastructure on a portion of Class 'A' Reserve 18324. An easement for the purpose of 'Drainage Pump Station' is required to protect the Water Corporation infrastructure and allow formal access for maintenance.

The easement will cover a 2,189m² portion of Class 'A' Reserve 18324 as shown on the parliamentary sketch.

In accordance with section 44(2) of the *Land Administration Act 1997* (Act), the proposal was advertised in *The West Australian* newspaper on 21 October 2021. At the conclusion of the designated period for comments, no comments or objections were received.



ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF MOUNT LAWLEY EAST METROPOLITAN REGION CITY OF STIRLING


