C096. Hon Martin Aldridge to the Minister for Emergency Services

I refer to the activation of Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) in response to Tropical Cyclone Ellie and associated flooding, and I ask:

- 1. Please table the State Government request to the Australian Government for DRFA activation:
- 2. Please table the Australian Government response in relation to (1);
- 3. How many applications have been made for the WA Freight Resupply Subsidy for 'essential consumer goods'; and
- 4. Is the Minister aware of the need to support freight exports from the Kimberley region and is he considering extending support for this purpose?

Answer

- 1. The process for requesting DRFA activation happens at a department level, as a preliminary notification to the Commonwealth Government. I table the attached DRFA Notification Form.
- 2. I table the attached DRFAWA Eligible Disaster Proclamation Notification.
- 3. As at 16th February 2023, 33 applications have been received.
- 4. The Western Australian State Government is investigating the necessary support packages for the Kimberley region.

Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements 2018 ATTACHMENT A – Notification Form

In accordance with clause 5.1.1 of the *Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements 2018* (the *arrangements*), when an *eligible disaster* occurs and the relevant *state* knows, or expects, the *eligible disaster* to be an *eligible disaster* the *state must* notify the *department* of that fact within three (3) months. The *state must* do this by submitting a completed Notification Form to Emergency Management Australia (EMA).

Section 1 – Event Details

The information provided in Section 1 of this form will be used to inform the *Commonwealth* about the *eligible disaster*. Please provide a detailed description of the event including, but not limited to, the impacts/damage caused and how it meets the definition of an *eligible disaster* in accordance with clause 1.1 of the *arrangements*.

Section 2 – Assistance Measures

The information provided in Section 2 of this form will be used to inform the *Commonwealth* about the assistance measures the *states* intend to claim cost against in relation to the notified event. Please list the notified Local Government Areas (LGA) and identify the assistance measures being made available under Categories A and B. *States must* clearly identify the assistance measures they intend to claim against, by using a cross (\boxtimes) and/or dating accordingly.

Assistance approved by the *Commonwealth* under Categories C and D (including dollar amounts) will be completed in the Notification Form by EMA and provided to the *state* via a supplementary Notification Form.

• Section 3 – Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements 2018 (DRFA) Event Factsheet
The information provided in Section 3 will help states to develop a jointly branded factsheet that can
be used by both the Commonwealth and notifying state. The factsheet must include detailed

Completion of Section 3 of this Notification Form will ensure the *state* complies with this clause.

• Section 4 - Public Announcement

The information provided in Section 4 of this form will be used to inform the *Commonwealth* about whether the *state* wishes to issue a media release to announce the assistance being made available under the *arrangements*. In accordance with clause 5.2.1 of the *arrangements*, the announcement of an *eligible measure* or *eligible measures must* be through a joint media release, or other joint announcement, unless otherwise agreed by the *Commonwealth*. Where the *state* requests the urgent release of a media announcement, it is the responsibility of the *state* to provide a draft joint *Commonwealth-state* Government media release to EMA to announce the assistance.

Supplementary notifications

All sections of the Notification Form and factsheet *must* be updated to reflect the extension of notified assistance measures and LGA. Additional notified assistance measures and LGA *must* be highlighted or dated accordingly, to distinguish the supplementary assistance being activated.



- River rises and areas of flooding are adversely affecting road conditions in the region with many roads impassable and damaged, homes, other buildings and businesses inundated, communities isolated and people displaced and evacuated.
- 200mm of rain observed in Broome in last 24 hours prior to 4am 4/01/23, with 2 more days of similar falls expected.
- Gail force winds are also impacting the Shire of Broome including the townsite of Broome.

The event was declared a Level 3 Incident by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services on 3/1/2023 at 9:30am. Level 3 is the highest level as this event was assessed as such due to:

- requiring significant coordination of a multi-agency response;
- there is a protracted response duration;
- resources need to be sourced from multiple levels (for example, State, National or International level);
- there is a high level of complexity;
- there is a significant actual or imminent impact on critical infrastructure;
- there is a significant impact on the community (social, built, economic and natural);
- evacuation and/or relocation of community is required;
- there is an actual or potential loss of life or multiple, serious injuries; and
- declaration of an 'Emergency Situation' has occurred.

Specific impacts on each of the notified Local Government Areas

Impacts experienced across the Kimberley, including in the Shire of Derby West Kimberley, Shire of Broome, Shire of Halls Creek and the Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley

- Across the Kimberley region river rises and areas of flooding has adversely affected communities, roads and other
 infrastructure with many roads impassable and damaged; homes, other buildings and businesses inundated and
 damaged; communities isolated; and/or people displaced and evacuated.
- Current state road closures include (Main Roads WA 5/1/2023):

Power supplies have been disrupted. Road closures and the weather throughout the region is causing disruption to supply chains, including the supply of food and other goods to towns and communities. Given the response phase is still underway and due to flooding and weather conditions it has not been possible to assess the full extent of damage, but information in relation to event related impacts will continue to be collected from local governments and agencies in the region.

2022/23 DRFAWA ELIGIBLE DISASTER PROCLAMATION NOTIFICATION

AGRN1044 – EX – TROPICAL CYCLONE ELLIE AND ASSOCIATED FLOODING IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA (28 DECEMBER 2022 ONWARDS)

The above event has been proclaimed an *eligible disaster* under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements, Western Australia (DRFAWA) on 5 January 2023, pursuant to clause 5.1 of the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) (the *Arrangements 2018*), issued by the Commonwealth Government Department of Home Affairs. The State Government will provide financial assistance to those people who have been affected through joint State and Commonwealth disaster relief and recovery arrangements.

Ex-Tropical Cyclone Ellie crossed into Western Australia from the Northern Territory on December 28, 2022 as a slow moving tropical low. The low slowly tracked west across the Kimberley region resulting in significant rainfall and flooding across the region. Widespread rainfall totals between 200 - 500mm were recorded across the Kimberley region with major flooding occurring along the Fitzroy River. Flood levels peaked at Fitzroy Crossing, reaching a record level of 15.81m.

The Great Northern Highway has been significantly impacted by flooding and communities being isolated, including the towns of Fitzroy Crossing, Derby and Broome. Many remote indigenous communities along the Fitzroy River have also been isolated with damage reported to community infrastructure and homes.

Pursuant to subclause 1.1.1 of the *Arrangements 2018*, 'Storm' and "Flood" are deemed to be eligible *natural disaster* events.

For the purposes of the DRFAWA this event will be referred to as **AGRN1044** *Ex-Tropical Cyclone Ellie and Associated Flooding in Western Australia* (28 December 2022 Onwards).

DRFAWA is jointly funded by the State and Commonwealth Governments and administered by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES), with assistance from other agencies. Through DRFAWA, the Western Australian and Commonwealth Governments provide assistance to people who have suffered the direct impact of a proclaimed disaster event.

The Local Government districts currently subject to this proclamation are as follows:

Included 5 January 2023:

- Shire of Broome
- Shire of Derby West Kimberley
- Shire of Halls Creek
- Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley

If information becomes available that identifies other local government districts as potentially having been directly impacted by this disaster event, subject to further assessment these local government districts may, at a later date, be included in the affected area.

Assistance may be available for the following measures (where appropriate) typically covered by the DRFAWA:

• For individuals and families – Personal Hardship and Distress grants which are administered by the Department of Communities (Child Protection and Family Support Section). Potential measures include

emergency food, accommodation, clothing, temporary living expenses, replacement of essential household contents and housing repairs to return housing to a habitable, safe and secure condition. **Note –** some of these measures are subject to income and/or assets testing.

- For small businesses interest rate subsidies on 'new' loans approved by Authorised Deposit-taking Institutions (financial institutions).
- For Primary Producers Assistance may be available toward freight costs, materials for boundary fences (<u>only</u> where it is demonstrated that public safety is at risk), professional advice grants and interest rate subsidies on 'new' loans approved by Authorised Deposit-taking Institutions. These eligible measures are administered by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, Agriculture and Food (Rural Business and Development Group). Note Primary Producer Claims should be lodged before 28 June 2023.
- For Local Governments & State Government Agencies Clean-up costs and the restoration or replacement (to pre-disaster function) of essential public assets including local road damage. State road restoration is through Main Roads Western Australia. Only costs incurred that are 'additional' costs, and are directly related to the event, will be eligible for reimbursement.

Note - The allowable time limit for eligible on-ground activities related to Emergency Works and Immediate Reconstruction Works (EW and IRW), to Essential Public Assets, expires on 28 March 2023.

LG's wishing to seek an extension to the EW and IRW allowable time limit should contact the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements team to discuss.

Note - The allowable time limit for eligible on-ground activities related to Essential Public Asset Restoration Works (EPAR) expires on 30 June 2025.

Claims in respect of any other eligible measures may also be considered.

It should be noted that assistance under the DRFAWA is not designed to supplant or operate as a disincentive for self-help by way of commercial insurance.
