ATTENDANCE AT MARCH ON PARLIAMENT ON 25 MAY 2023

Key Message

Staff attendance at the march on Parliament arranged by the United Professional Firefighters' Union (Union) is subject to conditions which all staff are required to comply with.

What happened?

The Union issued Circulars 25/2023, 26/2023 and 27/2023 calling on members to march to Parliament on Thursday 25 May 2023.

What does it mean for me?

Staff who intend to attend the march on Thursday 25 May 2023 are advised:

- Staff working day shift on 25 May 2023 are not authorised to attend.
- 320/8 staff whose workplan includes ordinary hours on 25 May 2023 are not authorised to attend without approval. Any variations to 320/8 workplans including extended breaks must be authorised by a line manager.
- 320/8 staff who have been authorised by a line manager to take an extended break to attend the march must record the break on their timesheet.
- Applications for personal leave on 25 May 2023 must meet one of the eligibility requirements under the WA Fire Service EBA 2020 and evidence to satisfy a reasonable person is likely to be required.
- Wearing of uniforms and the use of any DFES vehicle, appliance or other equipment is not permitted at the march.
- Staff are reminded of the conduct requirements of Regulation 133 of the Fire Brigades Regulations 1943.

DFES looks forward to continuing productive discussions with the Union's bargaining team and reaching a negotiated outcome.
