Question: Mr D.A. Templeman asked: What is the cost for children to attend the camps at Woodman Point and Point Walter and the increases in those costs over the past few years?

Answer: Preliminary advice should note that the cost to government differs from the invoiced cost to the school customer. This difference is the community contribution to allow these amenities to be affordable, safe and enjoyable. The social benefit is the experience and learning.

Schools represent 69% of camps clientele. For 2010/2011/2012 a simple overview of average spends in the schools community (Tier 3) is derived from total schools revenue (ie. accommodation and programs).

Point Walter Recreation Camp & Conference Centre (PW)

In 2010 minimum per child cost for overnight stay is \$24.00

Schools represent 58% of camp business with average spend /overnight stay \$43.84

In 2011 minimum per child cost for overnight stay is \$24.00

Schools represent 59% of camp business with average spend /overnight stay \$45.78

In 2012 minimum per child cost for overnight stay is \$24.50

Schools are year to date 66% of camp business with an average spend /overnight \$48.01

Woodman Point Recreation Camp (WP)

In 2010 minimum per child cost for overnight stay is \$18.00

Schools represent 73% of camp business with average spend /overnight stay \$38.61

In 2011 minimum per child cost for overnight stay is \$18.50

Schools represent 71% of camp business with average spend /overnight stay \$42.03

In 2012 minimum per child cost for overnight stay is \$18.50

Schools are year to date 74% of camp business with an average spend /overnight \$39.11

Note:

- Woodman Point Recreation Camp_is nearly three times the size of Point Walter Recreation Camp & Conference Centre_and can accommodate multiple bookings.
- Point Walter Recreation Camp & Conference Centre_fees include linen and the camp offers a higher level of amenity.
- Adventure recreation program take-up for schools varies according to age, size and scope of the school excursion program.
- Camps staff provide specialist supervision to support school based program delivery and encourage participation in team and individual pursuits ie. “challenge by choice”.
- The 4th R (referring to Recreation) is a DSR Camps initiative to articulate for educators and principals the value of camp experiences to the education environment on behalf of the wider sector. This resource is currently mapped to existing curriculum, predominantly social outcomes and in the future will address relevant National HP&E curriculum (Health and Physical Education) as it is introduced.
