ALLEGED CORRUPTION PROCEDURES

3924. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Local Government:

Within the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries is there a procedure in place for the reporting of alleged corruption to the Director General and, if so:

- (a) What is the procedure (or procedures);
- (b) Who can report alleged corruption to the Director General;
- (c) How many reports of alleged corruption have been sent to the Director General since April 2017;
- (d) How many reports of alleged corruption have been received by the Department;
- (e) Which local governments have been reported;
- (f) When was the procedure last reviewed; and
- (g) How many of the reports have been forwarded to the Minister?

**Mr D.A. Templeman replied:**

- (a)–(g) Under the *Corruption, Crime and Misconduct Act 2003*, the department does not have jurisdiction to deal with alleged corruption.

Upon receipt of allegations of corruption, the asseter is referred to the Public Sector Commission or the Corruption and Crime Commission, who have the jurisdiction to deal with alleged corruption.
