

STATE RECORDS COMMISSION — ANNUAL REPORT — BORN DIGITAL STRATEGY

4325. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Culture and the Arts:

I refer to the Born Digital Strategy outlined in the State Records Commission 2017–18 Annual Report, and ask:

- (a) has the State Records Office’s Born Digital Strategy, which was prepared in 2017, had its implementation delayed;
- (b) if yes, what were the reasons for the delay in the strategy:
 - (i) is a shortage of staff in the State Records Office one of the reasons for the delay;
- (c) is poor resourcing and the Machinery of Government changes impacting on agencies’ ability to achieve the strategy’s objectives by the target of 2022; and
- (d) will the Minister direct more resources to speed up the strategy’s implementation:
 - (i) if yes, please list the resources that will be made available; and
 - (ii) when will they be made available?

Mr D.A. Templeman replied:

- (a) The draft Born Digital Strategy underwent a period of extensive review and consultation. It was published to the State Records Office’s website on 9 November 2018 as Born Digital: Managing Government Information and Data.
