OLD COAST ROAD, DANGEROUS TREES

Petition

Mr P.D. Omodei presented the following petition bearing the signatures of 36 persons -

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Parliament of Western Australia in Parliament assembled.

We, the undersigned, say:-

That we are frequent travellers from Perth to Bunbury and are very concerned that dead and dying trees along the old coast road will inevitably fall onto the road resulting in the death and or serious injury of travellers using the old coast road.

There are dozens of trees hanging over the road and it is patently obvious that they are in an advanced stage of decay and could fall at any time.

We all know that the State Labor Government has been aware of the situation for quite some time and are alarmed that no action has been taken to make the road safe.

Now we ask the Legislative Assembly to make the State Government aware of our concerns and request the Government move immediately to take any necessary action to remove dead and dying trees adjacent to the old coast road with the intention of making it safe for the travelling public.
