- 2. (a) 17
 - (b) 20
 - (c) 27 as at 30 June 2004. Main Roads is currently in the process of recruiting an additional five (5) Heavy Vehicle Operations Inspectors. These are expected to be in place by the end of 2004. This pool of applicants will be used for further recruitment over the next six months.
