 - (b) 2005-2006; and
 - (c) 2006-2007?
- (2) How many people have been removed from the all categories of the surgery waiting list without having surgery carried out in the following years -
 - (a) 2004-2005;
 - (b) 2005-2006;
 - (c) 2006-2007 (year to date)?
- (3) How many people removed from the waiting list have been directed back to General Practitioners for reassessment for a position on the waiting list?

Mr J.A. McGINTY replied:

- (2) Reasons for removals without surgery include procedure no longer required, declined or no longer performed; patient unfit for procedure or deceased; and change of patient status, database audit or duplicate entry. The figures exclude counts of removals due to transfer to another hospital.

- (3) In line with the Department of Health Elective Surgery Access Policy Public and Private Patients, where a patient is removed from the wait list, they are advised by letter to contact their specialist, general practitioner (GP) and/or the Outpatient Clinic if they require further treatment.

The Department of Health does not keep records on whether patients who are contacted by letter subsequently see their general practitioner.
