Thanks should go to George Kelly and his wife, Christy, who initiated the event and did the fundraising; the Collie shire council; and Disability Services Commission members John Borlini and Mark Pianta, who also participated in the game as well as being very involved in organising it, although their skills were questionable! Wheelchair-bound local lad Perry Green played for the WA team, which was great. The game was such a success that one of the state players said that he would definitely come back, as the response from the town was incredible. Thanks also go to the Motorsports Group, Southwest Division for taking the state team members on a tour of the complex and giving them a taste of racing conditions. Watching an event like this was magnificent. The members of the wheelchair team are exceptional athletes and displayed strength and dexterity in their chairs. To see their skill level and enjoyment of the game was inspirational, and I recommend that everyone and anyone attend one of their games in the future.
