Further to Question No. 655 of May 15 2002 -

- Will the Minister advise why the Water Conservation Strategy for Western Australia was not finalised by October 2002 as originally promised?
- Considering the current water crisis facing the State, why hasn't the Government given this matter a (2) high priority?
- When will this Water Conservation Strategy be completed? (3)
- What plans has the Government made to implement a comprehensive water conservation strategy (4) instead of the current ad hoc approach?

Hon TOM STEPHENS replied:

The Minister for the Environment has provided the following response:

- The State Water Conservation Strategy was not finalised because its main recommendations were (1) incorporated into the State Water Strategy released in February 2003.
- Implementation of the State Water Strategy is a very high priority for the Government. Chapter 4 of the (2) State Water Strategy is on water conservation and efficiency and includes 30 tasks out of a total of 84 tasks in the Strategy.

- The State Water Strategy presents a coherent and comprehensive approach to water conservation as (4) detailed in Chapter 4 on water conservation and efficiency.
