477. Mr M.P. MURRAY to the Minister for Agriculture and Food:

I have a supplementary question. Part of my question asked what price was put on the IP of InterGrain; I did not hear an answer to that at all.

Mr J.N. Hyde: It's a government asset.

Mr D.T. REDMAN replied:

I just made the point that that is a commercial-in-confidence issue.

Mr M.P. Murray: Come on! It's a government department! How about tabling some of your reports as well?

Mr D.T. REDMAN: This company is required to behave in a commercial way.

Mr M.P. Murray: No wonder another crook got into the National Party—the whole lot of you are crooks!

The SPEAKER: Member for Collie–Preston, I gave you an opportunity to ask a supplementary question, not to continue to hurl invective across the floor. I am formally going to call you for the third time.

Mr D.T. REDMAN: I think I have actually explained the reason why I cannot put a value on that. I still believe that it is absolutely the right decision.
