POLICE — RETURN TO PRISON WARRANTS

1433. Hon Nick Goiran to the minister representing the Minister for Police:

I refer to the role of WA Police in the execution of return to prison warrants, and I ask:

- (a) how many police officers have been involved in such warrants in the current financial year;
- (b) what has been the average number of days between the date of issue and the date of service of these warrants; and
- (c) for how many days has the oldest warrant been outstanding?

Hon Stephen Dawson replied:

The Western Australia Police Force advise:

- (a) The Western Australia Police Force interpret the term 'involvement' as the number of officers involved in the end-to-end process of locating and processing the arrested person. Based on this interpretation, the Western Australia Police Force do not measure this effort nor record the application of those resources.
- (b) As of Friday 26 May, average number of days between the date of issue and the date of service of these warrants is 7.9.
- (c) As of Friday 26 May, the oldest warrant outstanding warrant is 225.
