

HOSPITALS — BEDS

777. Ms L. Mettam to the Minister for Health:

- (1) What was the average number of daily active beds for each month, across each metropolitan hospital in:
- (a) 2019–20;
  - (b) 2020–21;
  - (c) 2021–22; and
  - (d) 2022–23 to date?
- (2) What was the total bed capacity for the same time period as (1), for each metropolitan hospital?

**Ms A. Sanderson replied:**

- (1)–(2) Bed audits, to determine whether a bed is considered operational or non-operational, are not undertaken daily.

Annual monthly bed occupancy average rates for each public metropolitan hospital are presented below.
