HEAVY-HAULAGE TRUCKS, BRIDGETOWN

We, the undersigned, say that we wish to express serious concern regarding the dramatic increase in heavy haulage trucks that will be carting woodchips through Bridgetown on the South West Highway as a result of the closure of the railway line between the Diamond Mill site and North Greenbushes.

Now we ask that the Legislative Assembly direct the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure to clearly state the Government's intention in regards to the heavy haulage trucks travelling through Bridgetown and the proposal for the establishment of a new heavy haulage route.
