 - (d) 30 June 2004;
 - (e) 30 June 2005; and
 - (f) 30 June 2006?
- (2) What was the size of the corresponding payroll in each of those years?
- (3) By how much has the number of police officers grown since 30 June 2001, over and above losses incurred by retirements or resignations?
- (4) By how much has the number of teachers grown since 30 June 2001, over and above losses incurred by retirements or resignations?
- (5) By how much has the number of nurses grown since 30 June 2001, over and above losses incurred by retirements or resignations?
