

PRESCRIBED BURNING — FIRE MANAGEMENT GUIDELINES

1462. Hon Dr Brad Pettitt to the parliamentary secretary to the Minister for Environment:

- (1) Will the Minister provide a list of all Fire Management Guidelines for species and ecosystems currently held by Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA) and advise on their current status?
- (2) Will the Minister table the Fire Management Guidelines:
 - (a) if no to (2), why not?
- (3) How often are Fire Management Guidelines reviewed by the Department?

Hon Darren West replied:

- (1) Fire Management Information Notes (FMIN) are intended to provide technical information to guide those undertaking fire management activities.
