- (c) How many Deputy Principals were employed in 2022 by:

- (d) How many Deputy Principals were seconded or re-employed as teachers between 2022 and 2023;
- (e) How many teachers retired in 2022–23:
 - (i) How many retired teachers were recalled in the last financial year, as replacements could not be found for their roles even if this was only temporary;
- (f) How many pre-service teachers were deployed, in order to ensure that every classroom had a teacher;
- (g) How many relief teachers were deployed, in order to ensure that every classroom had a teacher;
- (h) What is the average class size per year level across the region;
- (i) How many cleaning contracts were not filled at the beginning of the school year; and
