## GENETICALLY MODIFIED CANOLA — CONTAMINATION TO ORGANIC CROPS

## 4643. Mr M.P. Murray to the Minister for Agriculture and Food

In relation to genetically modified (GM) canola contaminating organic crops, I ask:

(a) what action will the Minister take to prevent contamination of organic crops caused by genetically modified (GM) canola which causes loss of income and loss of certification of organic crops?

## Mr D.T. REDMAN replied:

(a) GM canola is not a contaminant. The Australian Gene Technology Regulator concluded that GM canola was as safe to human health and the environment as non-GM varieties in 2003.

Loss of certification due to the presence of GM material in an organic crop is a coexistence-related matter. The Department of Agriculture and Food will continue to provide growers with information to support the coexistence of different production systems.
