FOREST PRODUCTS COMMISSION — VINCE ERASMUS

955. Mr M.P. MURRAY to the Minister for Forestry:

Ms M.J. DAVIES: Vince Erasmus was the managing director of the Forest Products Commission. He has served exceptionally well and has done his job incredibly well. He informed the commissioners that he would not continue to seek to be employed by the Forest Products Commission.

Ms M.J. DAVIES: I will not discuss issues of employment with the Parliament. Vince Erasmus has handed in his resignation to the chair of the Forest Products Commission.
